We are developing exciting proposals for a new country dwelling in the heart of the South Downs. The design uses rammed chalk to create a series of linked monolithic forms (image 11).

Planning will be submitted imminently for a new dwelling and boat house at Bonar Bridge



on the edge of Loch Migdale. The design takes inspiration from traditional croft houses, local materials and the palette of the existing landscape.

Having recently achieved planning consent The Pool House includes an exciting swimming pool and gym via a delicate glazed link structure to a large country house in Tilford, near Farnham. The architectural approach creates a form that blends well with the surrounding landscape and creates opportunities to enjoy the glorious views.





Re-Format has developed an elegant design for the conversion of a Grade II* listed chapel in Kensington to create a unique family home. Living spaces will be within the heart of the chapel, retaining the dramatic internal volumes and clear spatial hierarchy, additions are contemporary and legible such as the library podium and 'altar curtain' kitchen, which read as pieces of furniture, and the ethereal glass mezzanine.
