Aldgate Tower, City of London

We have won planning permission for a 20-storey residential tower in White Church Lane, Aldgate on behalf of Unique Property Group. The proposal addresses the various technical challenges presented by the highly constrained site, to create a new landmark at this gateway location into the Square Mile.



Welford Road, Nottingham

We are delighted to have been granted permission for this riverside apartment scheme along the River Trent in Nottingham. The project, which is sensitive to both the risk of flooding and the proximity of neighbouring properties, will be a modern and tasteful addition to the area near Trent Bridge Cricket Ground.



Boltro Road, Haywards Heath

Planning has been submitted on behalf of our clients McCarthy Stone for 50 later living apartments containing communal lounge facilities, and hotel-style guest suite. The designs seek to moderate the width of the plot by creating vertical interplay with the use of strong feature balconies, which breaks the massing along the streetscene.





Gosport Waterfront

In collaboration with Gosport Borough Council, we have devised a redevelopment plan for the Bus Interchange, envisioning a dynamic mixed-use development at this strategically located waterfront site.

The site, which boasts spectacular views of Gunwharf Quays in Portsmouth, has been designed to serve as a prominent new landmark for Gosport, marking the terminus of the high street and forming a public plaza that fronts Falklands Gardens. The new retail frontage, which lines the route to the Ferry and waterfront Millennium Walk, is a key aspect of the design.

The proposal features a striking 20-storey pair of towers with a glazed vertical beacon, intended to create a striking visual presence when viewed from across Portsmouth Harbour. The development comprises 200 apartments, a hotel, retail and food and beverage outlets, commercial space, rooftop gardens, and a sky deck. Additionally, the scheme aims to enhance the existing plaza and bus interchange facilities.

Wichlestowe, Swindon

Re-Format created a masterplan for the new Wichlestowe District Centre on the south western outskirts of Swindon for Anchor Care and McCarthy Stone. 120 units are proposed across two schemes set between a new landscape canal side setting create a fantastic new addition to this new district in Wiltshire.



Commercial development

As we continue to expand our commercial portfolio, we have been working on proposals for various logistics, manufacturing, light industrial, automotive, and office use clients.

We have recently submitted plans for a 50,000 sq ft business park for Gentian at Buckmore North (image 7), and an expansion of Venture park for PPE clothing provider Swift 360 near Alton (image 8).

Construction has began earlier in the year on our design for a new headquarters for renowned glasshouse manufacturer Alitex in West Sussex (image 9), due for completion in 2023.

We have also developed several automotive-related schemes, including a classic car village concept (image 10), as well as a high-end spray facility for McLaren, and a resotration facility and car showroom for Jaguar XK specialist

Hospitality in hertiage settings

In 2022, we submitted plans for two hospitality projects that involve the revitalisation of listed buildings. The first, located in Ventnor on the Isle of Wight (image 13), is a hotel and

16 guest lodges, while the second, situated in the vicinity of Midhurst in West Sussex, is a 35 bed wellness retreat and wedding / conference venue (image 14).

Townhouse development, Liphook

We have submitted planning for three high-quality, sustainable, homes on an unused brown field site in the town of Liphook, Hampshire. Our design is sensitive to the local context, whilst also being contemporary and distinct. To add visual interest to the street scene,

rather than repeating the same elevation, we built a triptych composition with a diversity of appearances that is read as an ensemble. The material palette of larch timber boarding and brickwork creates an understated appearance in the streetscene.





Brockenhurst College

Work is to commence on our new Independence Hub for Brockenhurst College in the New Forest. The building will incorporate a special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and rehouse its existing foundation studies department. We are working with project managers Peter Marsh Consulting, contractor Ascia, and structural engineers Paul Basham Associates.

- Planning consent for Whytton house, replacing a small dwelling with a 7,000 sq ft new dwelling (image 18).
- Planning consent Heathwood House for a considerable 9,000 sq ft renovation and extension project in West Sussex, on site, due for completion in spring 2023 (image 19).
- Planning consent for Viola Hill, a 8,500 sq ft replacement dwelling which utilises IFC, below the Ashford Hangers in the South Downs is nearing completion (image 20).
- Completion of Barnsnap, a low energy house near Horsham, with our clients now happily installed (21).
- Completion of Farm Cottage, which creates a dramatic central double height living space (image 22).

Wispers, Stedham

We are delighted to embark on a transformative project of a country mansion, designed by the renowned Victorian architect Richard Norman Shaw, to create Wispers. Working with Banor Capital, the development will create a picturesque rural retreat comprising 33 homes. The listed mansion will be reimagined as apartments, while the surrounding parkland and grounds will be revitalised and landscaped to accommodate a mix of new builds and restored historic structures. We have meticulously crafted four distinct character areas, drawing inspiration from traditional farmsteads, horticultural and kitchen gardens, and whimsical ornamental woodland gardens. This is a rare opportunity to restore an important Vernacular Revival Estate in an idyllic rural setting.
